



 - Long-range & multi-disciplinary
 - Prioritization of needs

- Good design





Who Are We Planning For?

- Network for all forms of mobility, not just recreation
- Residents are <u>much younger</u> than County or State averages
 - more families + larger household size
- Very low poverty rate (3.5%)
- *Everyone* is a pedestrian at some stage of every trip!






Study Area






Traffic & Safety

Observations:

- US 74 / Independence Boulevard: The dividing line in Indian Trail
- Lots of people, few connectors: Concentrated traffic on few roads = more points of conflict
- High volume = more separation: Sidepaths, sidewalks with verge create distance from traffic






Walking & Biking Safety

Observations:

- US 74 / Independence Boulevard: The dividing line in Indian Trail
- Activity Centers:
 - Many pedestrians ~ Greater exposure



Plan Review



WalkIT (2009) Pedestrian Plan

- Expands pedestrian network
- Emphasizes safety, recreation & connectivity



ImagineIT (2022) Comp Plan

- Emphasis on improving bike & walking network
- Creates "Villages" (6) and "Corridors" (2)

Carolina Thread Trail Plan (2011)

- Identifies preferred route through Town
- Connects Indian Trail with Stallings, Wesley Chapel & region



Ordinance Review (UDO)


- Thorough treatment of bike & ped considerations

- **Crossing** major roads & intersections are a core safety issue.




